5th Grade Homework

- Independent Daily Reading happens in class and at home. (more information in a moment!)
- Math is assigned by each math teacher based on unit being instructed.
- ELA and Content (Social Studies/Science/Health) will be assigned as needed, but not routinely.



Independent Daily Reading (IDR)...

- Students self-select what they read.
- Students read at home and at school.
- There are **NO TIME LIMITS** or reading logs.
- Students will interact with the teacher weekly about what they are reading.



5th Grade Grading...

- All assignments are expected to be completed on time, neatly, with best writing skills.
- Graded work will have percents and/or letter grades on it to indicate the score.
- Work scored as “completed” in the gradebook will have other marks, such as stars, checks, or a sticker.
