Students and families have access to view work completion and grades.


Weekly announcements will be posted on Sundays at 6:00 p.m. and will give you an overview of the week.

Language Arts

Homework

Make sure to check students' grades in Canvas for incomplete work. Also be on the lookout for inbox messages about missing work.

Students should finish all assignments that were not finished during the school day. Incomplete assignments will be sent home in the Home folder. We will encourage students to take home their folders on a regular basis, even if they are empty.

Read to you, read to a pet, read to a family member or read to themselves BUT **read**!

Math homework will be sent home for students to complete. The focus will be on reviewing concepts and math fact mastery.

Home Folders

Students will regularly (if not daily) come home with their Home Folder. This folder will include classwork assignments that need to be completed. As well as, graded work and office mail. Please clean out the folder and return to school on regularly.



Data Binders

Data Binders will go home the Friday after a major assignment (published writing piece, reading assessment, or math module test) is returned to your student, so that you can review your student's work and witness their growth. You will be asked to review the work, sign the signature page, and return it to school with your student the following Monday.

The entire Data Binder will go home with your student at the end of the school year.
